The Connecticut Energy Efficiency Board (EEB) invites you to a Public Input Session for development of the 2022-2024 Conservation and Load Management (C&LM) Plan. Two sessions will be held in August to allow stakeholders an opportunity to attend. The meetings will be webinar only; webinar information is provided above. Please note: the EEB will hold its August monthly meeting, also by webinar, immediately following the August 11 Public Input Session.

Established through CGS 16-245m, the EEB is comprised of ten voting members¹ representing business and consumer interests as well as state agencies, and five non-voting representatives of the state's electric and gas utilities. It advises and assists the utilities in the development and implementation of Connecticut's energy efficiency and demand response plans.

The EEB welcomes and encourages input as part of its collaborative process with the electric and gas utility companies, the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP), the CT Green Bank, interested stakeholders and the general public, to develop the 2022-2024 C&LM Plan. Public input will inform the EEB and DEEP on the allocation of C&LM resources for energy efficiency and demand response programs and related activities for both the 2022-2024 Plan and for the 2022 program year. **During these meetings, the EEB is looking to engage with stakeholders on the key priorities of the next Three-Year Plan:**

- 1. Decarbonization**
- 2. Equity**
- 3. Energy Affordability**
