The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) is a law aimed at promoting clean energy and reducing greenhouse gas emissions. It includes tax credits and rebates to facilitate the purchase and installation of energy-efficient and electrification upgrades, including weatherization, heat pumps, heat pump water heaters, and electric panel upgrades. Here are the details:

- 30 percent capped tax credit for residential efficiency and electrification upgrades, up to \$3,200 per year
 - Annual total credit for air source heat pumps and heat pump water heaters capped at \$2,000
 - Up to \$600 for electrical panel upgrades if they are installed in conjunction with and enable a heat pump or heat pump water heater
 - Up to \$1200 for insulation and air sealing (products only, labor costs not eligible for credits)
- The tax credit limit is annual (not lifetime), so it resets each year and can be used again
- Households must have adequate tax liability to claim credits
- 30 percent tax credit for ground source heat pumps has no annual cap and can be carried forward year-to-year

Qualifying Equipment

The Heat Pump Qualified Products List (HPQPL) specifies exactly what equipment qualifies for the tax credit. Head to EnergizeCT.com/HPQPL for more information.
